The Underground Railroad Museum bus tour visits sites in Keeseville and Peru that are significant to the Underground Railroad History.

Tours depart from our museum, which is the former Herbert Estes home. Estes was a Civil War Veteran who later supervised the Ausable Horse Nail Works. Where the entrance of the Chasm is today was the site of the factory.

The tour passes down the Kent Road - main route from the Port Kent Ferry Landing on Lake Champlain to Keeseville. Most likely the path that "freedom seekers" may have taken to get to the Peru area or the pathway through the Adirondack Mountains to St. Lawrence County to Ogdensburgh and across the St. Lawrence River. John Thomas, who is featured in the museum may have taken this road.
